SEGMENT NAME: Brandt Beach

SEGMENT LOCATION: Mattapoisett, Massachusetts (Map attached)

MAXIMUM DEGREE OF INITIAL OILING: Heavy (Oiling Score: 2.49)

SEGMENT INSPECTION STATUS: Passed IRAC criteria endpoints on 08/22/2003.

SITE-SPECIFIC INFORMATION

PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS:

Primary Shoreline Type/ Geology:

• 1D: Rip rap seawalls, bulkheads, piers, docks, and pilings.

Secondary Shoreline Type/ Geology:

- 1B: Less utilized semi-public and private sand beaches; and
- 1C: Mixed sand and gravel (pebble to boulder) and rip rap groins (jetties); and
- 1F: Salt marshes.

Hydrogeology:

• Shaws Cove is located to the west and Buzzards Bay to the south. Fringing salt marsh is located toward the eastern and side of the segment.

Bedrock Geology:

 Bedrock underlying this segment is identified "Alaskite" bedrock formation. This bedrock consists of mafic-poor gneissic granite commonly containing muscovite (Zen, 1983).

ENVIRONMENTAL SENSITIVE RECEPTORS (Identified within 500 feet of segment):

Aquifer: None at segment.

Protected Open Space: At segment.

Public Ground Water Supply Wells: None at segment.

Public Surface Water Supply Wells: None at segment.

<u>Segment Use</u>: Private and semi-public beach and marsh. Residential dwellings are located within 500 feet of the segment. A portion of segment is accessible via roadway. <u>Frequency of Use</u>: Presumably seasonal and year round residential use.

05/07/2003	Area of heavy oil coating (approximately 1 to 9 feet wide by 98 to 344 feet long with 1% to 50%
	surface oil coverage) was observed. Several areas of pavement, tarballs, and tar patties (ranging
	between 1 foot to 20 feet in diameter) were observed along the segment. Oiled wrack was also
	observed in the upper intertidal zone. Additional cleanup activities were warranted.
05/11/2003	Heavy and pooled oil observed near beach. Tarballs and tar patties also observed. The observed
	surface oil coverage was 11% to 50%. One area (approximately 6 to 9 feet wide and 100 feet
	long) observed with oiled wrack mixed with tar patties and pavement. One area (approximately
	3 by 1,000 feet) with tarballs and tar patties (approximately less than 1% surface oil coverage)
	was observed. Cleanup crew was on-site during the inspection.
05/23/2003	Continued maintenance and ongoing cleanup activities observed.






DATE	SUMMARY OF INFORMATION RECORDED BY INSPECTION TEAM
11/05/2003	Site reconnaissance and potential buried oil inspection: Trace surficial splatter observed.
11/07/2003	Site reconnaissance: Portion of segment (primarily Howards Beach) was inspected during
	cleanup activities conducted at W1F-02. Evidence of oil was not recorded.
01/05/2004	Site reconnaissance and potential buried oil inspection: Splatter primarily scoured to a stain was
	observed on boulders. One tarball under a rock was removed.
02/19/2004	IRA citizen report of oil and field response: A citizen called GeoInsight on 02/19/2004 to report
	evidence of oil. GeoInsight and the citizen inspected a portion of the segment. Hardened
	tarballs (ranging approximately 0.5 to 6 inches in diameter) unrelated to the B120 release were
	observed concentrated in two areas on the rocky shoreline.
03/30/2004	Site reconnaissance: Evidence of oil was not recorded for this segment.
04/05/2004	Site reconnaissance and potential buried oil inspection: Very trace splatter (pea- to quarter-size)
	scoured to a stain on cobbles was observed primarily in upper intertidal zone.






NATURAL HERITAGE AND ENDANGERED SPECIES MAP


