

Take I-93 South to Rtc. 3 in Braintree. Continue South on Rtc. 3 to the Sagamore Rotary. At the Rotary, take Rtc. 6 West, 4 & 1/2 miles to the Bourne Memorial Circle.

From The West:

Take Interstate 195 to Rte.25/I-495, to the Rte. 6/Rte. 28 exit. Follow Rte. 6 East 5 miles to the Bourne Memorial Circle.

From The Cape:

Take the Bourne Bridge to Rte. 6 West. Follow Rte. 6 West to the Bourne Memorial Circle.

At the Circle take Lincoln Avenue to Nick Vedder Road to reach the Inn, which will be on the left. For Massachusetts Maritime Academy, follow the signs to Buzzards Bay upon leaving the circle and turn right at the first light.
